
### **About Us**

### **Evaluations**

#### **Comprehensive Evaluation**

The first step in the treatment of reading difficulties is appropriate identification. We comprehensively examine current literacy and attentional skills by measuring reading, spelling, attention, hearing, intelligence, and social-emotional behavior. We provide results, a summary, and recommendations in a report format, which can be used to inform appropriate interventions.

#### Reevaluation

Reading skills of individuals receiving intervention are periodically reassessed in order to determine progress.

#### **Attention Testing & Titration Monitoring**

We use gold standard tests to measure attention and impulse control. For individuals using medication, we offer titration monitoring. This involves periodic assessment and performance comparisons to help determine whether medication is improving attentional functioning.

## **Products**

#### **Screening and Evaluation Tools**

We offer psychometrically sound reading screening and assessment tools to educators and other service providers.

#### **Books and Curricula**

We offer informative children's literature, texts for adults, and science-based literacy curricula.

### Interventions

#### **Reading Intervention Program**

For individuals with reading difficulties or at-risk of experiencing reading difficulties, we offer science-based reading intervention. Our intervention services typically involve individual training sessions for 30 to 60 minutes weekly or biweekly either in-person or online. Flexible sessions are based on the family's schedule.

#### **Week-Long Intensive Intervention**

Our intensive program involves in-person intervention 6 hours per day for five days.

#### **Secret Codes Summer Camp**

Summer tutoring is available to any individual. These small group sessions are one hour each day Monday through Thursday during June and July. Secret Codes Camp is offered in person or online.

## **Training**

#### **Professional Development**

We offer a range of learning opportunities for individuals, family members, educators, school administrators, interventionists, and other professionals. Conference keynote and breakout sessions are available. Topics include literacy, executive functioning, psychological functioning, multitiered systems of support, and more.

#### Consultation

We offer consultation services and advocacy support in-person and online to families, educators, and others.



### Costs

Evaluation and intervention fees are based on family income.
